#### The Old Bench



You don't have to be a cat lover to find merit in reading three books in our church library based on true experiences with cats.

DEWEY, written by Vicki Myron, tells the true story of an abandoned kitten that was stuffed into the return book slot of a public library in Spencer, Iowa. Dewey becomes a permanent resident of the library, and this book tells his story of how he transformed a library, inspired a town and touched the hearts of many.

MAKING THE ROUNDS WITH OSCAR by David Dosa, M.D. is the true story of Oscar, the cat, and his mysterious and peculiar ability to hold vigils at the bedside of dementia patients at their end-of-life stage.

In her book, THE CAT WHO CAME BACK FOR CHRISTMAS, Julia Romp tells the true story of the bond between her son, George, who has autism, and the family cat. The connection between the cat and George helps him to make remarkable progress until the day the cat goes missing.

Children will enjoy reading PRINCESS GRACE AND THE LITTLE LOST KITTEN, based on the parable of the lost sheep. Troon Harrison's book, A CAT IN THE STABLE, tells the story of Sophie who, when her beloved cat dies, asks God to bring Muffin back to her. God answers her prayer in a surprising and wonderful way!

## Worship and Music Task Force

#### **WORSHIP TEAMS**

For many of us, Faith Lutheran Church and the people in it provide the anchor that keeps us upright as we go about our daily lives. We are incredibly blessed to have a couple of awesome pastors who work hard to teach, preach, counsel, pray with/for us and support us in a thousand other ways every single week. We enjoy weekly worship in this beautiful worship space with modern amenities and comfortable pews. We belong to committees and special groups who serve this church family in countless ways. Without volunteers, there is very little that could be accomplished here at Faith. We literally run on volunteers. Worship Teams are one way that we have been able to streamline the recruitment of volunteers for participation in the worship service. This will be our 3rd year, and it has been an incredibly positive experience for those who have participated. We are so thankful for the 125 faithful volunteers who make up 15 worship teams for 2 services every Sunday

morning. This is what each team is responsible for:

- Two ushers, who greet you as you enter the Sanctuary for Worship, take offering and let you know when it's your turn for communion.
- A tech person, who sits in the booth in the back of the sanctuary and advances the power point slides for our liturgy and hymns.
- A reader, who reads the scripture during the service.
- Several assistants to serve Communion alongside our Pastors.

Each team is, typically, assigned 5 or 6 Sundays during the school year and another 1 during the summer. Please take a few minutes to consider joining one of the teams. The teams are doing well, but a few more on each team would help to cover absences that are bound to happen. We are preparing the fall schedule, and there is a place for you on one of the teams!

#### **MUSIC OPPORTUNITIES**

I think we would all agree that music plays a very important part of each worship service. I believe that the gift of music is something that we all possess in one form or another. Most of us enjoy singing the hymns at worship or listening as those around us sing. We enjoy the piano or organ music and special music provided by individuals or groups, including Sounds of Faith. If you play the keyboard or piano at home and are ready to play for us, there's a place for you here. If you have been given a gift of music, play an instrument or have the desire to sing and share your gift with others, you can do that here. You may choose to play or sing a solo selection, or join the choir or Sounds of Faith, or sing in a small group or ensemble. When you are ready, all you have to do is talk to one of the pastors, to Cheryl or Caitlin in the office, or myself. Just let us know what you need in the form of accompaniment and when you would like to share your gifts.

#### **ARTISTS**

If you are an artist or a person who loves to design, decorate, embroider, paint or sew, we would love for you to help us add to a Visual Arts team to assist the Altar Guild and Visual Arts person in creating meaningful visual experiences for our worship space, and providing additional backgrounds, and items for seasonal decoration.

Sometimes we need to be reminded that our creative gifts are God Given. By God's design, we don't all have the same gifts. But we can all do something. Our intent is not to create pretty banners or art exhibits to look at for our own sake, but as a way to offer to God our praise and gratitude. Our aim is not to "Provide Musical Entertainment" for our own sake, but to share our gifts in Praise to our God. Our goal here is not to "rope you into something just to get the job done," but to invite you and encourage you to help shape the worship experience. Please watch for sign up opportunities, now and throughout the church year.

# Pastor Sylvia's Parables

"Sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, singing and making melody to the Lord in your hearts, giving thanks to God the Father at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." Ephesians 5:19-20

Shirley, my sister's godmother, has been on my mind a lot lately. Since my sister and I grew up away from our extended family, Shirley and her husband Sonny were surrogate grandparents for us. If my parents had to go out of town or work when we had a day off from school, we stayed at their house. It was a second home to my sister and me. There are a lot of things I remember from Shirley and Sonny's house: the giant bean bag chair in their living room, the collection of angel figurines on the buffet, the homemade sourdough biscuits we stuffed ourselves with if we happened to be lucky enough to be there on a Saturday morning.

But one of the things I remember most is the singing. Shirley was always involved with

music at our church, and for many years she led a Cherub Choir for the small group of kids we had. She loved teaching us all kinds of different songs, which we often practiced if we were at their house. Some of our favorites were "The Circuit Riding Preacher" and "Jesus Makes House Calls" (if you don't know those ones, I highly recommend looking them up on Youtube!). We learned "Do Lord"

and "Good Morning, Lord" and "This Is the Day" and "I Am a Promise" - all by heart, because Shirley didn't let us use song sheets! If you couldn't remember the words, you were just supposed to mouth the word "watermelon" over and over.

Many of those songs are still the heart songs of my faith, and in my memory I can hear all of them in Shirley's Tennessee drawl. When I sing those songs today, I feel a tangible and powerful connection to God, to Shirley and Sonny, and to so many others who are part of the communion of saints.

Many of you have already shared with us a couple of your favorite hymns - your heart songs of faith - when we asked you to in worship a couple of weeks ago. Thank you! It has been so fun to see which songs are your favorites and read your words about why these

songs are meaningful to you. If you haven't had a chance to do this yet, it is not too late! Call or email the church office and tell us about one or two of your favorite hymns. We will be incorporating these songs into worship in July and August as we do a summer worship series called Faces of our Faith, which focuses on lesser-known Bible stories that shape our faith. Alongside those stories, we will sing these songs that have shaped and carried our faith. They connect us to so many saints, often the ones who taught us the songs to begin with

I am so looking forward to singing your heart songs with you - maybe I will even learn a new one or two! I hope you'll join us this summer as we sing hymns and spiritual songs together, making melody to the Lord Jesus, who does indeed make house calls.

# WND Synod Assembly Reflections

Below are reflections from our members who attended the WND Synod Assembly, held this year in Waford City, the weekend of June 2nd.

The Synod Assembly teaches me more about my church, myself, and the mission we share. I enjoy it and anyone that gets a chance should go. I believe any of us would benefit from it and be glad they went.

This year in our church, the theme has been witnessing Jesus, and that same theme was carried over to the Synod meeting. In John 17:18, the Bible tells us: just as you sent me into the world, I am sending them into the world. Telling people about Jesus and how he has transformed you, saved you, and renewed your life is witnessing, and is obedience to him.

So in the beautiful area of Watford City, I had to evaluate why I haven't been witnessing the way Jesus wants me to. As Lutherans, we are not really brought up to witness about Jesus, and, let's face it, have not used our opportunities as well. But this is something we all must work at, we are not to make excuses. After all, what if our story or stories helped someone else come closer to Jesus? We have all been called, now Jesus sends us. - Lyla

#### WND Synod Assembly Reflections Continued

This year I had the opportunity to attend Synod Assembly for Western ND. I didn't grow up Lutheran - instead, I was shaped by a variety of different Christian traditions - and while my husband and I have been attending Faith Lutheran for five years, this was a fantastic way to learn more about this place we call home, and I was struck by the consistent Lutheran emphasis on grace and faith. The assembly's theme, "Witnessing Jesus" highlighted stories from around the synod about the tangible ways lesus is seen as we take care of one another. The educator group "JUSTmove" challenged us to become aware of the disparate levels of power we might have as we go through life and to use that to create spaces where all are included. We also voted on a number of resolutions, including staying connected to other synods by sending greetings, considering how to step back into the civic space with collective engagement after the loss of LSSND, and committing to educating ourselves about the false doctrine of Christian nationalism that creates a false equivalency of the church with the US, privileges certain kinds of faith expression, and provides political cover for anti-democratic actions. I left feeling closer to the broader Church family, refreshed in my spirit, and encouraged that the good work we do each and every day is the work of the gospel - helping those around us witness Jesus and his love for all of us. - Karen Michalka

Getting to attend Synod was very special. I was inspired seeing how the Lord is at work throughout Western North Dakota. It was also a great learning experience to see in a practical way how the Church is organized and handles the challenges of being a disparate body of believers. In some ways the voting and discussions were fairly pedestrian, but there was also something special about members from many congregations coming together and deciding as a body where our time and resources should be directed for this upcoming year. And who can say no to getting to spend time with Pastors' Derek and Sylvia for the weekend? - Joe Michalka


