

READING

Luke 5:1-11

The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the 5th chapter. Glory to you, O Lord!

Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets." When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.

BRINGING IT HOME

This section provides guidance on how to discuss a passage from the Revised Common Lectionary for the week as a family! The devotions for this week are for Isaiah 6:1-8

Prayer

God of justice, the things filling our hearts with compassion and our brains with curiosity are your invitations to us to help heal the world. When we notice them, may we, with courage and excitement, cry out, "Here I am! Send me!" Amen.

Reflection Questions

- What does Isaiah see during his vision in this scripture?
- Isaiah's people are being attacked by the Assyrian Empire, but they are being protected by God. How did Isaiah feel and respond when he saw his vision of God's power? How did he feel about the Assyrians' power?
- Isaiah felt uncertain about his own abilities to lead and help his people. Have you ever felt unsure about your abilities when facing a challenge? What did you do?
- Even though Isaiah feels unsure, when God calls for someone to lead, he says, "Here I am! Send me!" What do you think helped Isaiah say yes to God, despite his worries?
- We're in the season after Epiphany when we focus on how God calls us to work for justice, just like Isaiah. As you work for justice, name some ways you can say, "Here I am! Send me!"

Did you know?

Did you know the angels in Isaiah's vision were quite shocking in appearance? It's no wonder Isaiah was overwhelmed!

Look up depictions of the seraphim described in this passage. How would you feel if you encountered a mythical creature like a seraph?



Who are the people you can trust with a problem or injustice? Even when they are not available, you can imagine your group of advisors and consider what they might say about your next steps. Your brain is full of helpful advice!

Guiding Activity

In our scripture for today, Isaiah gets to see something most humans never get to see: God's full might and power. There's a phrase we use to describe when someone gets to see what someone with a lot of power is really like. We say they are "peeking behind the curtain." Isaiah has seen the power of the Assyrian empire as it has invaded and attacked his people. Now, as his people feel powerless after the death of their king, Uzziah, Isaiah is given a glimpse at the mighty power of their God. Not only is God's power greater than any human empire, but it's also a different kind of power. It is a power that protects and empowers others.

Play a charades-like game together with children in your life exploring what it's like to face different kinds of power. Invite someone to act out a particular kind of leadership, selecting from the idea list below. Then, as a group, discern how to ask the type of leadership on display for help. Ensure there are some positive forms of power represented, as well as forms that are not. Then, decide together how you should respond to this person's power. Should you: "Challenge it," "Work with it," "Learn more," or "Call for help?" During each turn, discuss what it would look like to choose each possible course of action and what the outcome might be. If you have a curtain you can use as a prop, you can even have the children in your life "peek behind the curtain" as they encounter each leader. Some types of powerful people:

- Benevolent king or queen
- Strict, but fair, school teacher
- Corrupt politician
- Local activist
- Public servant (e.g. police officer, firefighter, etc.)
- School bully
- Unjust dictator
