READING

Gospel Reading: Luke 9:28-36

The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the 6th chapter. **Glory to you, O Lord!**Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah"—not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.

BRINGING IT HOME

This section provides guidance on how to discuss a passage from the Revised Common Lectionary for the week as a family! The devotions for this week are for Exodus 34:29-35

Prayer

God of glowing transformation, in the beginning, you said, "Let there be light." With dazzling rays, your light sparked warmth and life. It fractures into rainbows, photosynthesizes into energy, and dances with darkness to cast playful shadows. May your illuminating light shine forever. Amen.

Reflection Questions

- This scripture passage paints a very vivid picture. Vivid means to have a clear image come to mind. What words and images stand out to you?
- This is the season after the Epiphany when we focus on God's revelation in the world. How does God reveal Godself to Moses in this story? How does it impact Moses?
- Share a time when you were so excited that it showed on your face. What did it feel like? What did it look like?
- Moses' face was transformed when he spent time with God. Transform means taking what is there and creating something new out of it. Describe what it might feel like to spend time with God, seeing God's glory and light as Moses did. How might it transform us?
- Having been transformed by God's light, Moses shared God's light with his community. How can we share light with others that transforms our communities?

Did you know?

Did you know tiny electrons are moving at the atomic level?

Look up the science behind how objects shine because of electron movement at the atomic level and what causes things to be shiny. Discuss how even small movements can have a big impact.



Guiding Activity

When Moses encounters God on Mt. Sinai, his whole face is transformed, and it's shining for all the people to see. When we experience big feelings, we often feel them in our bodies and in our minds. It can show on our faces and, sometimes, even in how we move our bodies. Invite the children in your life to listen as you name a big emotion aloud; then, invite them to show with their faces and bodies what the emotion feels like (see suggested emotions below). After a few examples, encourage the children to take turns suggesting additional emotions to express. This activity reminds us that how we move, speak, and act can show others the love and light of God shining within us. Discuss how we can show God's love and light with our voices, bodies, and actions. As we express our emotions outwardly, it's a great reminder that we can choose to express God's love and light in some way every day.

Examples of big emotions:

- Excitement
- Happiness
- Fear
- Relief

- Sadness
- Anger
- Love
- Sympathy
