

The Courage of Faith

The witches are coming. The ghosts and goblins will soon be playing tricks on us. If we are lucky, we will watch the Great Pumpkin rise from the pumpkin patch. And red will adorn the sanctuary of Faith Lutheran when we honor the courage of Martin Luther.

Courage in faith is most difficult when an event occurs that hurts one's beliefs. One night in the mid 1960s I was alone in the kitchen with my mother and father. My mother collapsed and fell to the floor. That was when I learned my sister will be getting married in a Lutheran church. It was the most devastating news that Catholic parents could receive. No compromise could be made between the four of them.

We did not attend my sister's wedding and an estrangement began. Within a few years my mother and sister reunited. For my father it was several more years.

If you have ever watched the movie Fiddler on the Roof you would understand my father's pain. Tevye's third daughter Chava chooses to marry Fyedka, an Orthodox Christian. Because she married outside of her faith, her father was devastated and disowned her.

My father was devout to his faith and until recently I didn't realize the courage it took for him to reconcile with his daughter. Martin Luther and Vincent Kubischta both needed the courage of their faith to make a change.

Pastor Derek's Parables



Grace and peace to you, siblings in Christ!

There are a few things that are supposedly "Off Limits" to talk about with others — Politics and Religion. Those are the two big topics that everyone says to steer clear from. There is another topic that I think people stay away from more than those other two even —MONEY. Now, money gets talked about a lot, but only in terms of how to make more of it or what new thing am I going

to spend my money on. When the conversation starts getting around to budgeting, planning, goal setting, and generosity that's when we start to clam up and begin to change the topic.

Jesus, however, talked a lot about money. 15% of his discourse with others was about money. 11 out of 39 parables were directly about money. Money is a huge part of our lives and our existence as human beings. It can have the capability to take over our lives in a negative way and it can also be a tool that is used for great good in the world. Jesus knew the dangers that money could have on our lives and the power and control that it could have over us.

These are the reasons we as followers of Jesus need to talk about money. We need to address the baggage that comes up with money. Shame, anxiety, greed, scarcity mindset, and any number of other feelings and emotions arise when we talk about money based on our current situation and our past history. This is why it's important for us to talk about it and explore our relationship with money so that we can better understand its impact on our lives and our emotions.

Beginning in the month of October we will be doing just that as we begin a worship series called "Our Money Story." We will be reflecting on our relationships with money and how we can change the narrative of shame and guilt into God's story of grace and generosity.

We will also be facilitating a bible based money management course called "6 Weeks on Money" that will give individuals and families the tools to gain financial well-being which frees us to be generous and live out of God's abundance. The course teaches basic financial concepts like budgeting and getting out of debt, but it also teaches the reason why we should do those things. It teaches us how to discern what our values are and how we can plan and make goals according to our values. I highly encourage you wherever you fall on the financial health spectrum to join us for this course. Please reach out if you are interested or have questions.




