READING(S)

First Reading: Jeremiah 33:14-16

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David; and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. In those days Judah will be saved and Jerusalem will live in safety. And this is the name by which it will be called: "The Lord is our righteousness."

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 3:9-13

How can we thank God enough for you in return for all the joy that we feel before our God because of you? Night and day we pray most earnestly that we may see you face to face and restore whatever is lacking in your faith.

Now may our God and Father himself and our Lord Jesus direct our way to you. And may the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, just as we abound in love for you. And may he so strengthen your hearts in holiness that you may be blameless before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his saints.

Gospel Reading: John 18:33-37

The Holy Gospel according to John, the 18th Chapter. Glory to you, O Lord!

[Jesus said:] "There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in a cloud' with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."

Then he told them a parable: "Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

"Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and

drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day does not catch you unexpectedly, like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man."

WEEKLY DEVOTIONS

Monday - Prayer

Stir up your power, Lord Christ, and come. You, O God, work through grace-filled beginnings. Open our eyes to your truth and lead us to your grace. In all things, help us to know that your grace is for us, for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Tuesday - Connections with the Liturgy

In the Lord's Prayer, we ask God to "save us from the time of trial." It is precisely the dangers and terrors of the eschatological end to which this petition refers. While the historic translation of the prayer uses "temptation," a 1988 translation more accurately conveys the meaning of the prayer ascribed to Jesus. Most Christians will indeed experience "a time of trial."

Wednesday - Let the Children Come

Happy New (Church) Year! Year C—the year of Luke—will find Jesus dining and teaching at tables more than in any other gospel. Begin this Advent season by including the children in your life in the process of preparing a table. Set it with a blue tablecloth and a simple Advent wreath. Talk about how Advent is a season of waiting and preparation, much as we take care preparing our tables for a special guest. You could even invite children to pray at the table: "Come, Lord Jesus, be our guest!"

Thursday - Connections with Creation

Could the connections with creation be more obvious in this week's gospel? Anticipation for the arrival of Christ, through whom the universe came into being, calls forth cosmic signs and crashing seas. Jeremiah speaks of the promised arrival of a savior like a shoot from a stump, a once-chopped tree with an unstoppable determination for life. One natural image that we often associate with Advent is conspicuously absent this week, namely pregnancy. Before Mary and her faithfulness take center stage, consider the ways that the earth itself prepares for God's arrival.

Friday - Reflection on the Gospel Reading

The reading calls us to join the Christians of the late first century, wishing for the end of all evil and sorrow and for the coming of the joyous reign of Christ. Christians believe that Christ has already come, is coming this morning in word and sacrament, and will come at the end of all things. Like a tree of life, the fig tree is already full of leaves.

Saturday - A Hymn for the Day

An appropriate hymn for this Sunday is "Hark! A thrilling voice Is sounding" (ELW 246). This anonymous medieval Latin hymn is filled with biblical references. Stanza 3 includes the prayer for forgiveness, since we are not blameless, as Paul had hoped. Even if the end of things is tumultuous, God comes to us in mercy. The hymn does a good job of describing what it is that Christians await at Christmas.
