Pastor Sylvia's Parables



For Christ himself has brought peace to us. He united Jews and Gentiles into one people when, in his own body on the cross, he broke down the wall of hostility that separated us. - Ephesians 2:14

As a pastor, I spend a lot of my time talking with people: about their lives, about the world, about God. Through these conversations, sometimes themes emerge - the things that are

keeping people up at night, stuff going on in the world that is on people's minds, cultural and societal events and patterns that are grabbing people's attention.

One of the biggest themes I've heard, time and time again over the past few years, is that people are noticing and concerned about increasing polarization in our families and communities. It seems like people are farther apart than ever, and that differences in religion, culture, and politics are becoming massive chasms separating folks from each other. Conversation and connection across these differences feels more fraught, less possible.

Maybe this is something you've worried about, too. Maybe you have someone in your life - a family member, friend, neighbor, coworker, or even fellow church member - that you struggle to connect with because of difference. Maybe you're grieving how hard it feels to have a respectful conversation in today's political climate. You're not alone!

As Christians, we follow Jesus, who broke down the wall of hostility between Jews and Gentiles, drawing all people into one community of God's children. Empowered by his love, we too can reach across divides of difference with love and compassion and respect. But it takes practice!

We are so blessed to have opportunities coming up this fall to reshape and positively impact our Bismarck-Mandan community by developing these skills. You are invited to a free workshop series called Skills for Bridging the Gap, led by FLC's own Dr. Karen Michalka, and co-hosted by us with Bismarck Interfaith and Bismarck United Church of Christ. This series is skills-based and interactive, geared toward helping us learn and practice how to reach respectfully and bravely across divides to connect with others in a meaningful way. No experience or knowledge is required, only a desire to learn and connect.

The series of hour-long workshops will be offered on **Wednesday mornings at 10am** here at Faith Lutheran on October 2, 9, 16, and 23 in the Fellowship Hall. It will also be offered on **Thursday evenings at 7pm at Bismarck United Church of Christ (1200 E Highland Acres Rd)**. The Thursday evening classes will also have a zoom option (call the church office for more information).

The four sessions will cover:

- What Motivates Us To Build Bridges
- How to Carefully Listen to Others
- How to Courageously Share Our Stories
- How to Engage Tension Constructively
