READING

Reading: *John 12:1-8*

The Holy Gospel according to John the 12th chapter. **Glory to you, O Lord!**

Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. There they gave a dinner for him. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at the table with him. Mary took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard, anointed Jesus' feet, and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was about to betray him), said, "Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and the money given to the poor?" (He said this not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief; he kept the common purse and used to steal what was put into it.) Jesus said, "Leave her alone. She bought it so that she might keep it for the day of my burial. You always have the poor with you, but you do not always have me."

PRAYER STATIONS

Personal Healing Prayers (center)

At this station, you are invited to join the leader in prayer for the healing power of God-given beauty in your life.

The Fragrance Filled the Room (Left side, near pulpit)

At this station, we recall the sensory beauty of the costly perfume Mary wiped onto Jesus' feet. Rub a small amount of lotion into your hands. Take your time, caring gently for your skin, and breathe in the fragrance. Offer a silent simple prayer to God as you do: thank you for beauty.

The Beauty of Holiness (Right side, near organ and cross)

At this station, visual art is offered as a tool for contemplation and prayer. Choose an image for contemplation and consider: What do you notice? What speaks to you? How does it show you a new perspective on the divine?

CHILDREN'S CORNER

Consider using this page to help guide the children in your life to explore how the needs we discuss in service impact our lives. This week we are exploring the need for beauty.

Kids are so good at seeing beauty. They notice the world around them in a unique way, and they bless the adults in their lives by sharing their perspective. One of the joys of being around children is having them point out to you all of the beautiful things they see.

Ask the kids in your life what they've seen today that is beautiful. Give plenty of time for responses. If they need a prompt, you might ask them what they see right in the room that is beautiful. Beauty isn't only visual, so work through the five senses and challenge children to provide examples of beautiful things they've not only seen, but also heard, touched, tasted, and smelled. Ooooh and aaaah over each response. Ask kids what life would be like without beautiful things, and why they think God created such beauty. Exploring what beauty is and why we need it will draw on the kids' wisdom, and it might even help you reflect, too! Dying eggs together is a great opportunity to talk about how we can create beauty ourselves.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- When has something seemingly frivolous or wasteful changed your perspective or your life?
- Where has beauty appeared in desperate or painful situations in your life, and how did it transform them?
- How can our worshiping community use beauty more effectively to welcome worshipers and help them connect with God?
- Judas' question presents a false choice between helping the poor and embracing beauty. What role could beauty play to better offer dignity and respect to guests of our congregation? What simple gestures can offer dignity to people who are seeking help?
- Research local public art, like the Bismarck-Mandan Art Trail, murals on buildings around town, sculptures in parks, or art found in locations like the Heritage Center. Who created and installed it? How does it honor and dignify the people who live near it?
