READING

Reading: *John 20:19-31*

The Holy Gospel according to John the 20th chapter. Glory to you, O Lord!

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

BRINGING IT HOME

This section provides guidance on how to discuss a passage from the Revised Common Lectionary for the week as a family! The devotions for this week are for Psalm 118:14-29

Reflection Questions

- A psalm is a song or a poem used in worship to help express joy, gratitude, sadness, and several other feelings. The author sings, "You are my God, and I will give thanks to you," having experienced God's steadfast love through difficult times. How do you express your thankfulness to God for the love God gives?
- The author talks about God's love even when others have rejected them. Recall a time when someone helped you feel loved. How did you feel?
- Reflect on other stories you've heard from the Bible. Where can you remember God's steadfast love showing up for the people in those stories?
- We are in the Easter season, where we celebrate the new life we have in Christ because of God's love. How does God's act of love change us and the way we live?
- This psalm reminds us to, "give thanks to the Lord, for God is good." What reminds you to give thanks for God's goodness every day?

Prayer

God of belonging, everyone is welcome in your love. There is no such thing as "too much" or "not enough." You value and celebrate everyone. Fill us with your overflowing love to build a strong, vibrant community where everyone belongs. Amen.

Activity

This week, we are reminded of the steadfast love of God in our lives, but sometimes, it can be difficult to remember we are loved. Invite the kids in your life to brainstorm phrases to remind them God loves them and is with them every day. Examples might be phrases like, "God is with you," "God's love is forever," or "You are worthy of God's love." If helpful, put some on a whiteboard or butcher paper for everyone to refer back to.

Gather some notecards and art supplies to use. Recall the reminders you brainstormed together, and invite the kids to create reminder cards of God's steadfast love to exchange with each other, or give to other people.

When everyone is finished, share cards with each other, reminding one another of God's love. Afterward, swap cards with each other if you would like. Brainstorm strategic places to put them that will help them recall God's love throughout the week (e.g., in a book, lunch bag, dresser, on a bathroom mirror, etc.). You can also give the cards out to different people you see throughout the week. End with a prayer asking God to help us remember—in the good and the bad—God is with us and loves us forever.

Look It Up!

Have you ever heard of a cornerstone? Cornerstones have been crucial parts of architecture, even as far back as ancient Egypt!

Look up what purposes they serve, like being a reference point for every other stone laid in a building.



Mindfulness and gratitude help us remember truths that keep us grounded when life is challenging.

Choose a verse from Psalm 118 to remind you of God's faithfulness. Write it on a scrap of paper, and carry it in your pocket.


