

## FLCW Mission Group Thank You

Our last shipment of items to Lutheran World Relief was sent in October. The total number of items shipped this year was 128 quilts, 28 personal care kits, 70 baby kits and 109 school kits. None of this could be done without the help of so many, such as the faithful quilters, sewers, anyone donating any supplies and the Men of Faith for delivering the boxes to the trucking company.

In addition, we sent 261 pillow case dresses to the Orphan Grain Train in Jamestown, and 15 quilts were given to our graduating seniors. We gave 10 large quilts and 7 baby blankets to Ministry on the Margins along with some miscellaneous items, and we gave 12 quilts to Abused Adult Resource Center. We gave 17 quilts to AASK (Adults Adopting Special Kids). They handle the adoptions for the state of North Dakota. We also need to thank Thrivent, Walmart and the Eagles for the monetary donations provided to us.

As you can see, we have had a busy year and have provided many items both locally and world wide. Thank you for your continued support.

## Pie and Coffee Day Thank You

Another fun Pie & Coffee Day has passed. It was nice to see the fellowship happening over that piece of pie and cup of coffee. This event could not happen without the help of many, many folks. Thanks to all who moved tables, unpacked and repacked white elephant items, made lefse and knoephla, worked in the kitchen, washed dishes, cleaned up tables, cashiered, and made purchases. The money raised was \$4,400 and will help many local community and Lutheran World Relief missions as well as supporting the women in seminary. The Faith Women also encourage Camp of the Cross attendees by paying 40% of each camper's registration.

## **Update from our Afghan Friends**

Abdul Malik, Shogufta, and Mohammad Zikria arrived on May 7th from Afghanistan. Within just a few short weeks of their arrival, they started taking English classes, bought a car, Abdul Malik got a job at Walmart, and he also started studying for his learner's permit. They also discovered that they would have another baby in January, which was a great source of excitement for their family. Over the summer, Abdul Malik got his driver's license and they attended classes for New Americans. They had a wonderful experience here in North Dakota, but ultimately decided to relocate to Virginia. The tough reality for them is that there are only 2 other families from Afghanistan here in Bismarck, which means that Shogufta was especially isolated (not an ideal situation as she prepared to have a new baby). Their move meant a bigger community of support for them and more job opportunities for Abdul Malik, who would potentially be able to work as a translator or in other, more skilled work rather than at Walmart.

They expressed their incredible thanks for our church's welcome and support of them in their first few months of life in America. It really meant the world to them. They experienced God's love and care through us; and they wish us many blessings from God in return. They also were able to pass on most of the goods and furniture we provided to other new families in our area. Your generosity made a difference! Thank you for following God's call to welcome the stranger by welcoming this family!

## Pastor Derek's Parables



God said, "Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness; and let them care for the fish of the sea, and the birds of the air, and the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth." (Genesis 1:26)

Grace and peace to you, sisters and brothers in Christ! For a very long time I thought that being made in the image of God meant that

God looked like a human being. Perhaps that is true, but I have grown to understand that when we are told in scripture that we are "made in God's image," scripture is speaking more to the nature of our very being and not necessarily what we look like. What does God look like? We have no idea.

Perhaps a better questions to ask is, "What is the nature of God?" Through scripture, tradition, and experience we have some ideas as to the nature of who God is. God is relationship. At the core of who God has been revealed to us to be, as Holy Trinity, God is relationship. God is love. God is generous.

These are 3 truths we can confidently claim about God and they are very important in understanding who we are as creatures who were created in the likeness of God. We are created to be in relationship. It's our purpose, to be in community with God and one another. We are created to love. And we are also created to be generous.

One of God's core attributes has to be generosity. After all, God gave everything life and then God gave it's care and safe-keeping to us. All that we have from the water we drink, the food we eat, the ground beneath our feet, the air we breathe, the materials that our clothes and homes are made of, ABSOLUTELY EVERYTHING is a gift from God.

When we live lives of generosity, we are living our life as God created us to be, in God's likeness. When we live out of generosity, we are literally showing the world the image of God. Generosity is one of the most powerful ways to preach the Gospel. People see God and God's kingdom here on earth when an act of generosity happens.

## A Head's Up about the New Bonhoeffer Movie:

A few years ago, during our Speaking of Saints series in Eastertide, we learned more about the life of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a German pastor, teacher, writer, and theologian who was a key founding member of the Confessing Church, which spoke out against the Nazi dictatorship of Adolf Hitler. Bonhoeffer was active in resistance efforts against the Nazi regime, including an assassination plot. Bonhoeffer was arrested by the Gestapo in April 1943, imprisoned, and then executed on April 9, 1945.

I was initially interested to see that a new movie about Bonhoeffer's life was being released this fall (*Bonhoeffer: Pastor. Spy. Assassin.*). I thought the name was a bit weird but was looking forward to the movie because Bonhoeffer is an important person within the Protestant tradition and I was excited for more people to learn about his story.

However, I soon saw that nearly all scholars in the International Bonhoeffer Society, as well as 86 of his 100 living relatives, and several of the actors involved, have written in opposition to the movie! What was going on?

It turns out that this movie is based upon a controversial and problematic biography of Bonhoeffer by Eric Metaxas. Far right groups have used this biography to misappropriate Bonhoeffer and his legacy for their own ends.

The International Bonhoeffer Society writes, "Today [Bonhoeffer's] life and work are increasingly used to promote political violence and to make false and menacing equations between our present time and the totalitarian Nazi regime. These dangerous narratives are cause for our deep concern. We, the undersigned, are scholars and church leaders from the United States and Germany who want to bring this misappropriation of Bonhoeffer to your attention for the sake of the common good. We represent many colleagues who share our concerns." His family writes, "We are horrified to see how the legacy of Dietrich Bonhoeffer is

increasingly being distorted and misused by right-wing extremists, xenophobes, and religious agitators. As direct descendants of the seven siblings of the theologian and resistance fighter executed by the Nazis, we can testify based on what we learned from our families that he was a peace-loving, freedom-loving humanitarian. Never would he have seen himself associated with far-right, violent movements such as Christian Nationalists and others who are trying to appropriate him today. On the contrary, he would have strongly and loudly condemned these attitudes... At a time when intolerance, antisemitism and other forms of racism and xenophobia, nationalism and authoritarianism are on the rise around the world, we believe it is important to clarify publicly: Dietrich Bonhoeffer fought narrow mindedness, oppression, and exclusion throughout his life." Cast members from the film wrote the following, "We, the actors of the film Bonhoeffer: Pastor. Spy. Assassin, by Todd Kormanicki are deeply concerned about the misuse of our film and the legacy of Dietrich Bonhoeffer by Christian Nationalists... To us, the story of Dietrich Bonhoeffer tells a tale about: speaking up against totalitarian regimes; and acting against systems of lies, bigotry, Nationalism, racism, antisemitism, homophobia, transphobia, xenophobia. To defend our history and culture from appropriation, historical revisionism. His legacy teaches us to always look out for the marginalized in our society; not to judge people for their race, gender, sexuality and class. Bonhoeffer would not judge how we find love, compassion, solidarity with one another. He would encourage us to find a way we can learn from each other and that our faith, whatever it may be, should never be taken away by extremist demagogues and always lead with Love. As the actors of this film, we hope this message will resonate with you as it's the reason we agreed to take on this project and honor Bonhoeffer's legacy. We distance ourselves from everyone who tries to take this film for narrative to take up arms and harm one another." I haven't yet decided if I will go see this new movie, given this response. But if I do, I will be certain to go in eyes-wide-open, knowing that this movie doesn't tell the whole story, and aware of how certain groups are misusing Bonhoeffer's legacy to justify their own violence. I hope you will, too. Let me know if you do see it, or would like to talk about this more. Pastor Derek and I can also recommend other books and articles about Bonhoeffer's life and legacy if you would like to learn more about this remarkable man.


